SKILLS, QUALIFICATIONS, REQUIREMENTS:

- Have reliable and consistent means of communication and transportation.
- Pass a federal-level background check via live scan fingerprinting.
- Teaching Artists must routinely lift, push, pull, or carry art supplies, equipment, instruments, and classroom furniture weighing up to 40 lbs. Must also bend, twist, reach, stand, and/or sit for long periods
- A minimum of two years of experience performing and/or teaching (preferred).
- Bilingual artists with skills to teach individuals with special needs are encouraged to apply

HOURS/COMPENSATION: Freelance work is not guaranteed; compensation is determined by the number of individuals who register for the class and the pre-negotiated fee minus our admin fee. For more information, read our [Instructor/independent contractor handbook](#).
